## **Guidelines for Authors**

## What have we learned on Cyclical Growth since the years of "High Theory"?

On the occasion of the Charles Gide conference « History of macroeconomics: from the years of « High Theory » (1926-1939) to modern approaches », I has been decided to publish a selection of the papers in a special issue of the Cahiers d'Economie Politique / Papers in Political Economy on Growth and Business Cycle (only the topic of the papers matters, not the title of the Sessions in which they were presented).

The Executive Committee of the Cahiers d'Economie Politique / Papers in Political Economy appointed Michaël Assous and Muriel Dal-Pont as editors of the special issue.

It is our pleasure to invite the participants of the conference to submit their papers for consideration for the special issue of Cahiers d'Economie Politique / Papers in Political Economy.

The following points lay down some guidelines for potential contributors.

- 1. We assume that those whose papers were selected for presentation at the conference thereby give the editors of the conference a "right of first rejection" for the paper.
- 2. Only papers which have been presented at the conference will be considered for publication in this special issue of the Cahiers d'Economie Politique / Papers in Political Economy.
- 3. The special issue of Cahiers d'Economie Politique / Papers in Political Economy will publish what the Editors consider to be the best papers given at the conference. According to our perception, a number of good papers devoted to the theme of Growth and business cycle were presented.
- 4. The final versions of the papers under consideration should reach us **no later than 30 September** 2012. The style (citations, emphases, references etc.) should conform to that of Cahiers d'Economie Politique / Papers in Political Economy. Please consult a recent issue of the journal for guidance on this. Please in any case respond to this mail and tell us whether you can meet this deadline.

- 5. Following the usual procedure of Cahiers d'Economie Politique / Papers in Political Economy, papers will be sent to two anonymous referees; their reports should have been completed by **30 January 2013**, and they will be forwarded to authors immediately upon receipt.
- 6. The final revised versions of papers accepted for publication should reach us no later than **30 April 2013**. We intend to submit them to the publisher during **June 2013**.

Please inform us whether you wish your paper to be considered for publication in the special issue. We look forward to hearing from you soon.
